WHY

In a port-related environment, tons of dangerous goods are traded, handled and stored every day.

Dangerous goods can be a risk to health, safety, property and environment. Following international and national legislation, stakeholders are obligated to handle these goods in the safest possible way.

It goes without saying that complying to safety regulations has added value for the entire port community and undoubtably pays off in the long run.

FOR WHOM

The program is directed towards safety inspectors responsible for dangerous goods, as well as people responsible for the general safety in the port. It would also benefit anyone with a need for knowledge in how dangerous goods are handled in a port related environment.

WHAT

The International Maritime Dangerous Goods Code is the main code for the transport of dangerous goods by sea. This serves to guarantee the safety of the ship, cargo and crew when transporting dangerous goods. It has been drawn up by the International Maritime Organisation (IMO) and is part of SOLAS chapter 7. Requirements are also being added from MARPOL. For example, it is indicated which substances are harmful to the marine environment.

- UN recommondations and other relevant codes from IMO
- IMDG Code Part 1 Consigment, training and security provisions
- IMDG Code Part 2 Classification and exercices

- Marking and labelling of packages / containers and exercices
- Documentation, stowage and segregation
- Practical use of the IMDG-code +
